## **STANLEY F. MELTZER, Esq.**

Stanley Meltzer has been practicing law since 1958. He holds a B.A. from Brooklyn College and, after two years in military service, received an LLB from the New York University, School of Law, where he won the prestigious Moot Court finals.

He became an Assistant United States Attorney in 1961, and was assigned to a wide variety of civil actions, involving tax, aviation, selective service, defense of malpractice and personal injury actions, agriculture, and the new and evolving field of Social Security Disability law.

After his return to the private practice in 1964, (ultimately becoming the senior partner in the New York City firm of Meltzer, Fishman, Madigan, and Campbell), many lawyers, physicians, and even judges began to refer Social Security disability clients to him, following with private and employer-generated disability claims and claims by union members, police officers, and firefighters.

Referred to by many as the dean of the Social Security bar, he was president of the New York Social Security Bar Association. He has handled matters in many jurisdictions and has been a frequent lecturer to various organizations.

Presently semi-retired, he is consulted by a number of law firms.
