LAWRENCE J. KORB

LAWRENCE J. KORB is the Director of National Security Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. Most recently, he was Director of the Center for Public Policy Education and Senior Fellow in Foreign Policy Studies at Brookings Institution. Prior to joining Brookings, he served as Dean of the Graduate School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Pittsburgh and Vice-President of Corporate Operations at the Raytheon Company.

From 1981-85, Dr. Korb served as Assistant Secretary of Defense for Manpower, Reserve Affairs, Installations and Logistics and was responsible for 75% of the defense budget. Dr. Korb, a former Director of Defense Policy Studies at the American Enterprise Institute, has held several academic positions at institutions including the U.S. Naval War College, the U.S. Coast Guard Academy, the University of Dayton and Georgetown University.

He has served as a consultant to the General Accounting Office and the National Security Council.

He was a member of both President Reagan's and President Bush's Defense Advisory Groups during their Presidential campaigns.

Dr. Korb spent four years on active duty as a Naval Flight Officer and retired from the U.S. Naval Reserve. He is the author of several books and publications including, The Joint Chiefs of Staff: The First 25 Years.

He has appeared on virtually every major network news program and has written op-eds for every major newspaper.

I studied law at the Catholic University of Nijmegen (Netherlands) and Philosophy at the University of Amsterdam. After finishing my law studies I worked at a law firm for 6 years.

I then became an in house counsel for the Port Authority of Amsterdam and after that for Vodafone, the first private telecom company in the Netherlands.

In 1997 I was asked to set up a negotiation and mediation institute for lawyers at the University of Amsterdam. I have served the ADR Institute as a Managing Director for 5 years and went to the Harvard Law School for several courses to become familiar with their negotiation research and training. Just as I was getting started as an independent consultant for the Dutch Ministry of Justice (organizing roundtable conferences on the future of the legal profession) and the Dutch Bar Association, my husband Rob Maaswinkel, was asked to represent the Port Authority of Amsterdam in the U.S. Before that he had represented the Port Authority of Amsterdam for 4 years in Dusseldorf/Germany.

I continued my work as an independent consultant for several organisations, and I am now working on a project with the Harvard Law school to develop a negotiation course for (international) law firms.

President Greg Lynch opened the meeting promptly at 12.15 and introduced Scarlett Pildes who led the club in the singing of “The Star Spangled Banner”, accompanied by Volker Detering at the piano. Our greeter for the week was Carmine Cabell. Filiz Akkaya offered the day’s invocation and touched upon peace, quoting the Nobel Prize nominated Kemal Ataturk, founder of modern Turkey.

Nick Uresin introduced one visiting Rotarian from a foreign country and two visiting from two states

President Greg welcomed one new club member, Christ’l Dullaert, a lawyer originally from Holland, sponsored by Bernhard Fabricius and Maria T. Angulo and presented her with the Rotary pin.

Helen Reisler introduced today’s main speaker, Stanley F. Meltzer, Esq., former Assistant U.S. Attorney and President of the NY Social Security Bar Association among many other prominent positions, now semi-retired.

Mr. Meltzer entertained the Rotarians with many interesting and amusing anecdotes from his long career. When he passed the bar exam in July 1958, the percentage of people that passed was only about 52, which he said was much lower than today’s figure. The old Fordham school had no air conditioning and it was 98 degrees. The test was about eight hours long on the first day. Students were allowed to not only take off their jackets but to take off their shirts too.

Mr. Meltzer shared many tips on how Social Security Disability works. It came across as a good support for those who need it, with a major proviso, and that is that you have to ask for what you want! The Government will not find you and give you your rights without your asking..

Mr. Meltzer described himself as a Civil Libertarian and described many fights for his clients against bureaucratic authorities. Sometimes decision times can be absurdly long. He told about one person who had had a broken leg and had been struggling with the system for a long time. When asked which leg it was, the sufferer said: “I don’t remember”

The winning lottery ticket had been bought by Carmine Cabell. He got a nice Rotary T-shirt. He got to keep the golf ball, but the winning one remains elusive.

The club joined Lou DiPaolo in recitation of the Four Way Test.

The meeting was adjourned at 1.30 p.m.

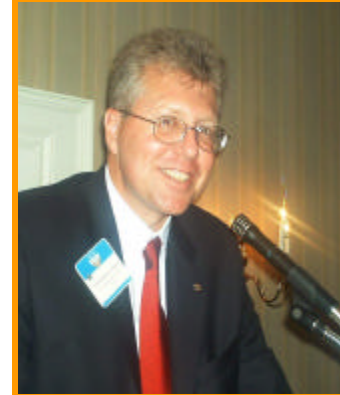
