Reverend Bishop Jean Marie Roger Kozik Founder and Superior General of Fraternite Notre Dame

The Most Reverend Bishop Jean Marie Roger Kozik founded the Fraternite Notre Dame religious congregation in 1971. Since then, he has invested all of his energies in fostering the development of this Catholic, charitable religious order, wholly devoted to divine worship and humanitarian assistance of the needy, with no distinction of class, race, sex, or creed.

From the beginning, the Most Reverend Bishop Jean Marie Roger Kozik was to surmount every obstacle and difficulty, thanks to his outstanding energy and courage. Since 1990, he has initiated many relief missions in various parts of the world: Martinique (FWI); Paris and New York City; Cameroon (western Africa); and Haiti, Mongolia, and Niger.

Through these missions, he was able to operate numerous services for those most in need, serving millions of individuals and families by way of soup kitchens, meals-on-wheels operations, health centers, hospitals, schools, and orphanages, including assistance to AIDS patients, lepers, and prisoners.

In 1998, a new mission was opened in Chicago, with the acquisition of an abandoned church, which he renovated for worship and a soup kitchen and several other services for the very poor. He also launched punctual missions to assist people victimized by disasters, notably in Romania, Rwanda, Albania, Croatia, and Kosovo; in El Salvador, China, and Japan; and in Colorado.

Over time, Fraternite Notre Dame became an NGO associated with the Department of Public Information at the United Nations, and the organization now enjoys Special Consultative Status with ECOSOC and is an NGO with UNICEF.

The Most Reverend Bishop Jean Marie Roger Kozik received Mayor Rudolph Giuliani's outstanding volunteer service award in recognition of his important work realized in the City of New York. As a New York Rotarian, he was honored with the Paul Harris Fellow Award.

He has been listed as an Honored Professional in Nationwide Register's *Who's Who in Executives and Businesses*, and early this year, his selfless work in Chicago was hailed by Mayor Richard M. Daley through the dedication of an honorary street sign in his name.

The Most Reverend Bishop Jean Marie Roger Kozik is a distinctive figure. For many years, he has been devoting himself to others in his tireless efforts to establish peace and unity among men and women of every race, creed, and nation, in a true Evangelical spirit of tolerance and compassion.
